Compounding Solutions

➔ Promethazine HCL 25 mg/gm Topical Lipoderm

"Many compounding pharmacies have had great success incorporating promethazine into a transdermal gel, which is applied to a thin-skinned area such as the wrist. This is a popular product in both pediatrics and obstetrics/gynecology practices, because it is less likely to cause drowsiness and discomfort than the tablet, suppository, or injection forms of promethazine" (Fields, 2005).

➔ Vitamin E Acetate/Vitamin A Palmitate/Hyaluronic Acid Solution Vaginal Cream

"Hyaluronic acid vaginal gel is not only an alternative treatment to vaginal estrogens, but also consider its general use in women presenting with vaginal dryness of any cause" (Stute, 2013).

➔ Anastrozole 0.1 mg Capsules; Anastrozole 0.25 mg Capsules; Anastrozole 0.1 mg Polyglycol Troche

Arimidex has been a very useful prescription agent with indications for first-line treatment of postmenopausal women with hormone receptor-positive early breast cancer, and the treatment of advanced breast cancer in postmenopausal women" (Biundo, 2010).
